ABOUT ARTSPOWER'S *CHICKEN DANCE*



Based on the book by Tammi Sauer and illustrator Dan Santat, ArtsPower's *Chicken Dance* is a fully-staged, 53-minute musical theatre production, presented in four parts, that features a cast of four professional actors, a rich and beautifully composed musical score, eye-catching sets and costumes, and a compelling story about two feisty chickens.

Marge and Lola are two chickens who want to enter the annual barnyard talent show so they can win two tickets to see singing sensation Elvis Poultry in concert. Throughout their quest to discover their talent, they are challenged by Mac the Duck, the barnyard bully, who is out to derail the chickens from winning the talent show. As they experiment with various possible acts for the show, Marge and Lola realize they are struggling to find a talent. Along the way, they can share their enthusiasm for entering the contest with Elsie, a shy and reserved cow who has no interest in entering. Eventually, Elsie decides to enter the contest.

As the talent show unfolds, and the chickens are next to compete, they decide to do what all good chickens do when they are in a pinch: "Wing it!" We hope you and your child enjoy ArtsPower's *Chicken Dance*.

Grade 3: Discussion Questions



WHAT YOU NEED FOR THIS ACTIVITY: Help from your teachers and/or grownups after watching each of the four parts of the *Chicken Dance* video.



DISCUSS: After each part, discuss the questions below with your teachers and/or grownups.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AFTER THE FIRST PART OF THE VIDEO

1. Who are the characters you met in *Chicken Dance*?
2. Where does the show take place?
3. What are the prizes for winning the barnyard talent contest?
4. What were the chickens wearing that made them look like chickens?
5. Who gets so excited about the idea of winning the two tickets to the Elvis Poultry concert?
6. What kind of animal is Mac?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AFTER THE SECOND PART OF THE VIDEO

1. What talents do Marge and Lola try as they search for their talent?
2. How is Mac the Duck acting when he sees the chickens practicing?
3. What kind of animal is Elsie?
4. What kind of animal is Elvis Poultry?
5. What happens to Elsie after she meets Elvis?
6. What talent does Elsie decide to try?
7. How do Lola and Marge react when they hear what Elsie wants to try?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AFTER THE THIRD PART OF THE VIDEO

1. When Elsie does not show up for the talent show, where do you think she might be?
2. Who are the animals that compete in the talent show?
3. Did you enjoy Mac the Duck's performance at the talent show? If you did, what about it did you most enjoy? If you did not, describe why.

Grade 3: Discussion Questions

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AFTER THE FOURTH PART OF THE VIDEO

1. Given that Elsie didn't really want to enter the contest at first, did you think she had a chance of winning?
2. What caused Lola to start singing and dancing?
3. How does Mac behave when he realizes that he has not won the contest?
4. Do you agree with the judges when they give Elsie the highest score of 10? Why?
5. What did you learn about dealing with a bully?
6. How would you persuade Mac the Duck to be kinder to the other animals?

Grade 3: Watch and Respond



WHAT YOU NEED FOR THIS ACTIVITY: A pencil.



WATCH AND RESPOND: Watch each part of *Chicken Dance*. Pay close attention to what Marge tells Lola to do. Also, keep an eye on Elsie. Then, respond to the questions below.

What does Marge tell Lola she can do to help her stay calm when Mac is bullying her? What is something that helps you calm down?

Marge tells Lola she is her “wing girl,” or someone who is helpful to Lola. Write about someone who is helpful to you and use two examples to explain how he/she provides help.

Grade 3: Watch and Respond

After we meet Elsie, she says she isn't going to participate in the talent show. Why does she say this?

We also meet Mac the Duck in the First Video Segment. How does he behave toward Marge and Lola? If you have ever had to deal with a bully, what did you do?

Grade 3: Watch and Respond

Elsie wins the talent show! How do you think she felt after winning, and why?

Describe a time where a friend or family member helped you to do something you were afraid of doing.

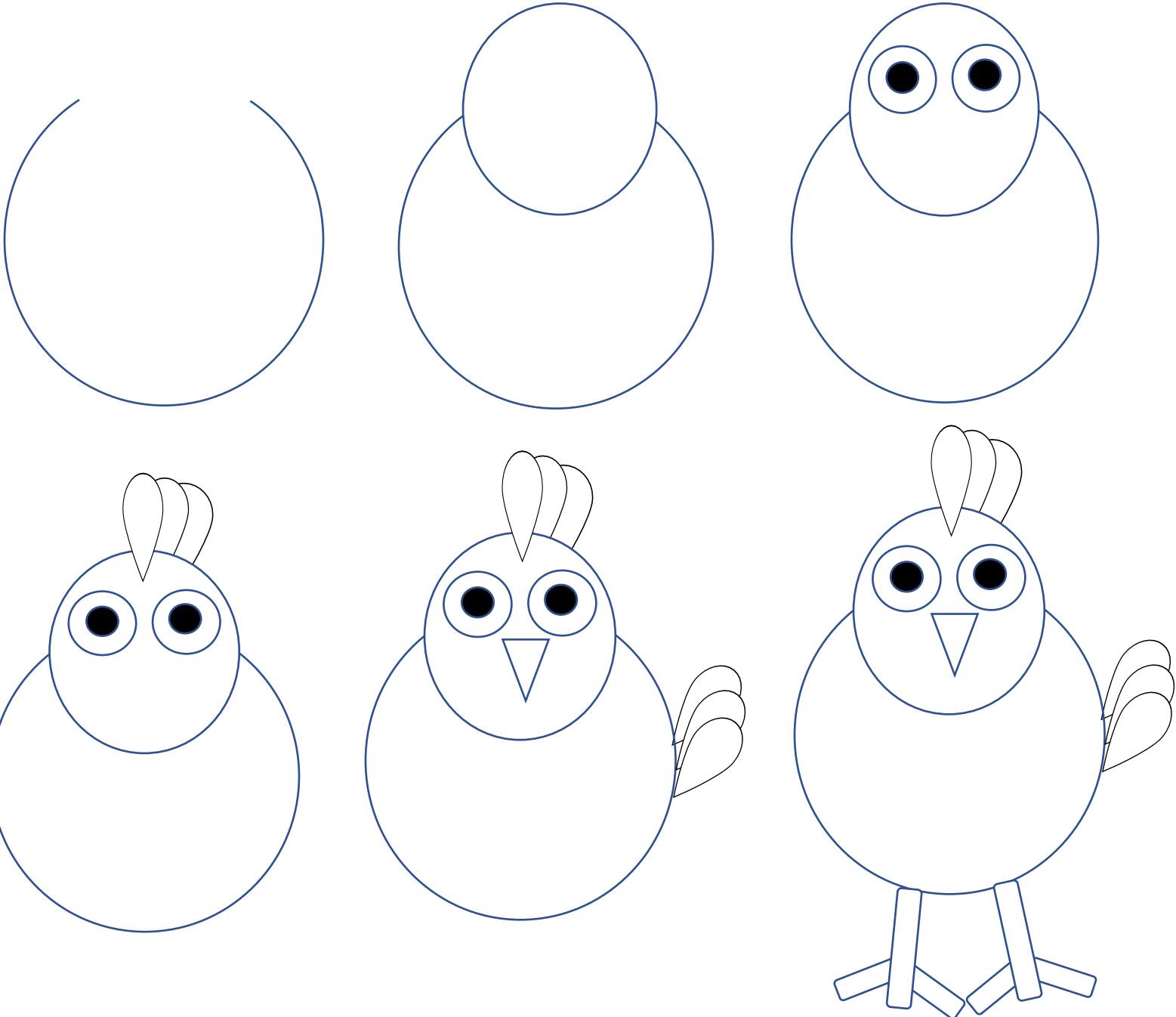
Grade 3: Marge, Lola, and Elvis Poultry Poster

Grade 3: Vocabulary Words



WHAT YOU NEED FOR THIS ACTIVITY: A pencil and/or crayons.



LEARN: Read the vocabulary words and their definitions below and learn what these words mean.

Barnyard

Definition: The area around the barn where the animals spend their time.

“We set up the stage outside, right here in the middle of the barnyard.”

Bawk

The act of making chicken sounds.

“All you chickens can do is bawk, flap, and shake.”

Contestant

A person (or animal) who takes part in a contest.

“Now our contestants will be scored on a scale from one to ten – one being the lowest and ten the highest.”

Friend

A person (or animal) who supports another person (or animal) by helping them.

“Marge and Lola are two chickens who are the best of friends.”

Illusionist

A magician or a person who performs tricks.

“May I present a magic act that will simply amaze you - with Marge the Magical and Lola the Illusionist!”

Jinx

To bring bad luck to or cast an evil spell on.

“No wait! We should just put it out of our minds! We don't want to jinx it.”

Juggle

To continuously toss into the air and catch more than one object at a time.

“Yeah, well you were the one who said: ‘Oh, I can juggle’.”

Grade 3: Vocabulary Words

Mantra

A word, phrase, or sound said repeatedly.

“Lola, breathe! Say your mantra – ‘OM!’”

Score

The number of points given when competing in a game or contest.

“Elsie deserves the score of a perfect ten.”

Talent

A special skill or ability.

“Hey Marge, I think I’ve finally found our talent!”
